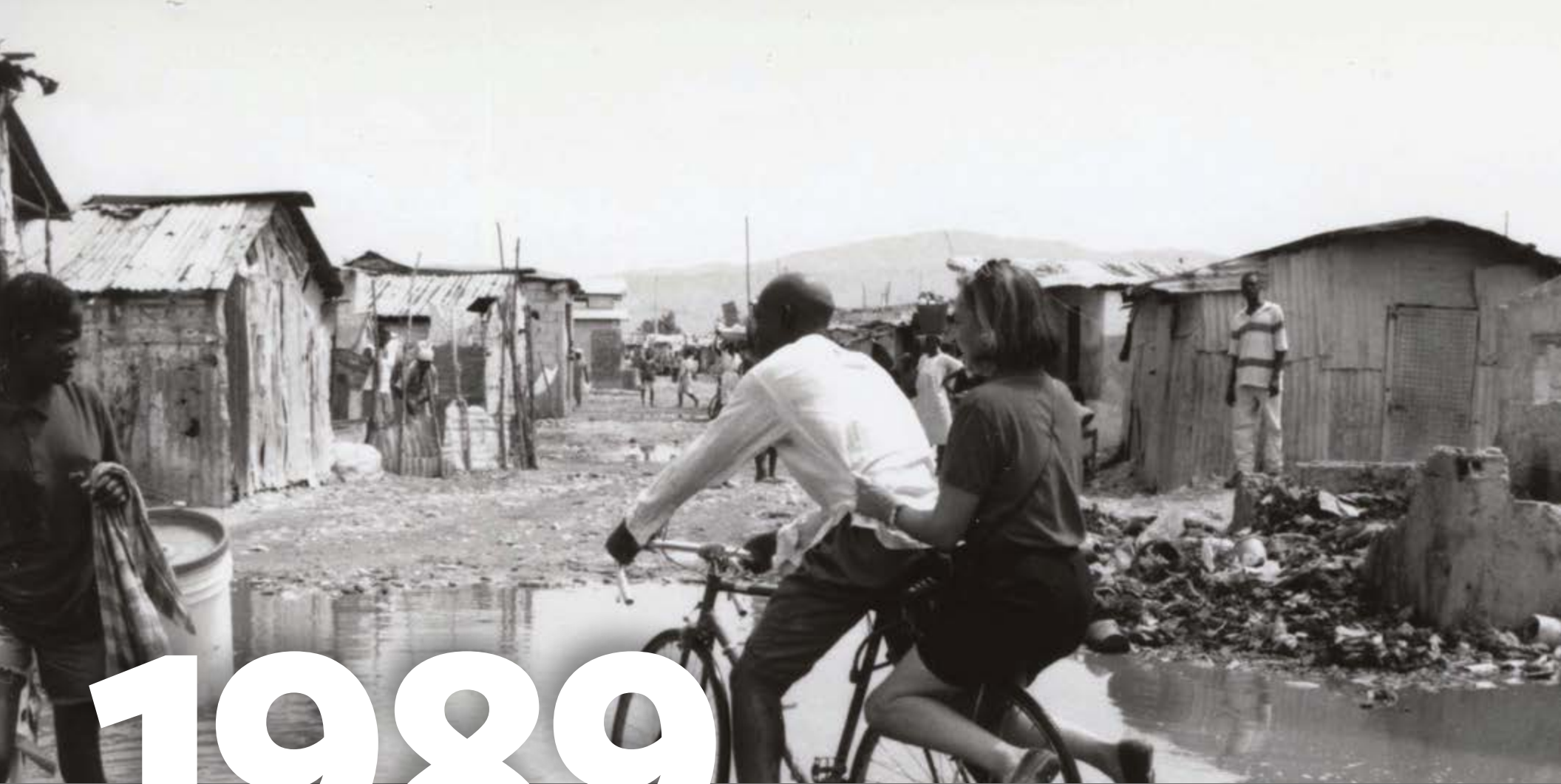

2005

Establish Les Cayes Home Base

The Missionary Oblates of Mary Immaculate offer Hope for Haiti a Guesthouse to serve as the organization's home base of operations.

Response Plans

Responds to the back-to-back hurricanes with the distribution of key survival materials to help families quickly recover. Develops a preparedness and response plan to ensure the organization is positioned for immediate action.

First Haitian Staff

Hope for Haiti hires first Haitian staff member.

Infirmiry St. Etienne

Renovates and opens the Infirmiry St. Etienne to serve the primary healthcare needs of the most vulnerable populations in Les Cayes. Dedicated to the memory of Charles J. Hughes, the facility has a full-time Haitian medical team and serves as the base of all of Hope for Haiti's healthcare operations.



2009

Teacher Salaries

Supports teacher salaries at 37 schools, reaching 500 teachers and 12,000 students.

Medical Supplies

Distributes \$15 million in medications and medical supplies to over 60 education and healthcare sites.

Nutrition Clinics

Funds four nutrition clinics saving the lives of over 5,000 children annually who suffer from severe malnutrition.

Seedling Nursery

Supports the success of a 100,000 seedling nursery in Aquin, Haiti, to help with soil conservation and provide for the nutritional needs of the community.

Impacting Lives

Impacts the lives of over 500,000 vulnerable men, women and children annually.



2010

Addressing Immediate Needs

Sends private planes, six 757s, and 1 DC-10 with supplies and personnel to address immediate needs in the disaster zone.

Emergency Buckets

Provides immediate response to January 12, 2010 earthquake with distribution of 1,000 Emergency Buckets to earthquake survivors.

Helping Disaster Victims

Establishes a clinic at an IDP camp to serve over 10,000 residents in disaster zone.

\$30 Million in Aid

Safely ships, stores and distributes \$30 million in aid to internally displaced people (IDP) and hospitals within the first six months.





2010

Emergency Support

Provides additional emergency support to partner schools in the aftermath of the earthquake.

Distribution of Supplies

Distributes \$20 million in non-earthquake related medications and medical supplies.

Volunteer Hours

Volunteers contribute over 11,000 hours!

1st Anniversary of Infirmary

Celebrates 1st anniversary of Hope for Haiti Infirmary in Les Cayes.





2011

Community Nursery

Cultivates over 15,000 mango, lime and hardwood seedlings in a community nursery selling over 600 to 350 school children and community members, reinvesting profits back into the nursery.

Providing Clean Water

Installs a GE water purification system capable of providing clean water to 125,000 people.

Vitamins & Medications

Distributes over 1.5 million children's multivitamins, 2,228 doses of Vitamin A, and 13,000 doses of de-worming medication.

Primary Healthcare

Infirmiry St. Etienne provides primary healthcare to over 10,000 patients.

Textbooks to Students

Organizes a Book Share Fund to 33 schools which provides 27,500 textbooks and notebooks to students.



2012

Sustainable Communities

Launches multi-year partnerships with The Bob & Renee Parsons Foundation and the Dalio Foundation, Inc. to push the sustainable communities and social business models forward.

Distribution of Supplies

Distributes over \$10 Million in medications and supplies through our Pharmacy and network of over 60 education and healthcare partners.

Health & Dental

Provides primary care to over 8,400 patients and dental care to over 1,500 at Hope for Haiti's Infirmary.

Organized Lesson Plans

Organizes lesson planning and French/Math instruction training for 137 teachers.

Supporting the Schools

Supports over 10,000 students and 400 teachers in 40 primary and secondary schools.

Healthy Babies

80 midwives successfully deliver 449 babies!

Progress out of Poverty

Surveys 366 households using the Progress out of Poverty Index (PPI™).

Reforestation

Cultivates over 27,000 seedlings to reforest mountainsides, providing nourishment and income to communities.



2013

Renewable Electricity

Installs 20 Bosch 230 watt solar panels in two community schools providing renewable electricity to over 700 people.

Improving the Schools

Implements small social infrastructure projects at the school level, including a school garden, nursery, improving landscape design and leasing a soccer field for community use.

Investing in Women

Provides over 200 women with financial literacy training and micro-credit loans to invest in their small commerce activities.

Rerouted a River

Reroutes a river to protect a rural school from future flash flooding with the support of Connecticut-based firm Building and Land Technology.

Freezer/Cell Phone Business

Launches a Solar Powered Freezer Business to provide community with cold drinks and ice and a Cell Phone Charging business, providing families with greatly needed access to electricity.

Upcycled Jewelry

Women-owned and led Upcycled Jewelry business is marketed online at local retailers in Haiti and the US.

School Reconstruction

Reconstruct and fully equip two major primary and secondary schools that are completely devastated by the 2010 earthquake in Port-au-Prince, meaning that 2,000 students have a safe place to learn that is built to international building standards.



2014

5th Anniversary of Infirmary

Infirmary celebrates 5th anniversary and Dr. Elvide Nazaire, Infirmary Director, receives the 2014 Real Award presented to an exceptional global health worker.

Best Care Center

Infirmary recognized as the best care center for the diabetic, high-blood pressure and asthma patients in the Les Cayes area.

A Focus on Care

Collaborates with mPower to install an Electronic Medical Records System streamlining patient files and enabling staff more time to focus on providing quality care to our patients.

Promoting Health

Trains 24 Community Health Workers to promote health and provide medical care and supplies at 12 schools and rural communities impacting over 2,250 students.

Clean Water

Installs two wells at school partner sites. Haitian Water Technician provides education around the importance of clean water and proper hygiene to the health of a community.

Gifts-In-Kind

Distributes over \$11 million USD in Gifts-in-Kind including life-saving medicines and medical supplies to 19 partners in Southern Haiti.

Girls Soccer

Launches and supports 2 girls' soccer teams in two rural school communities, which are the first of its kind in this area.

Hot Meals

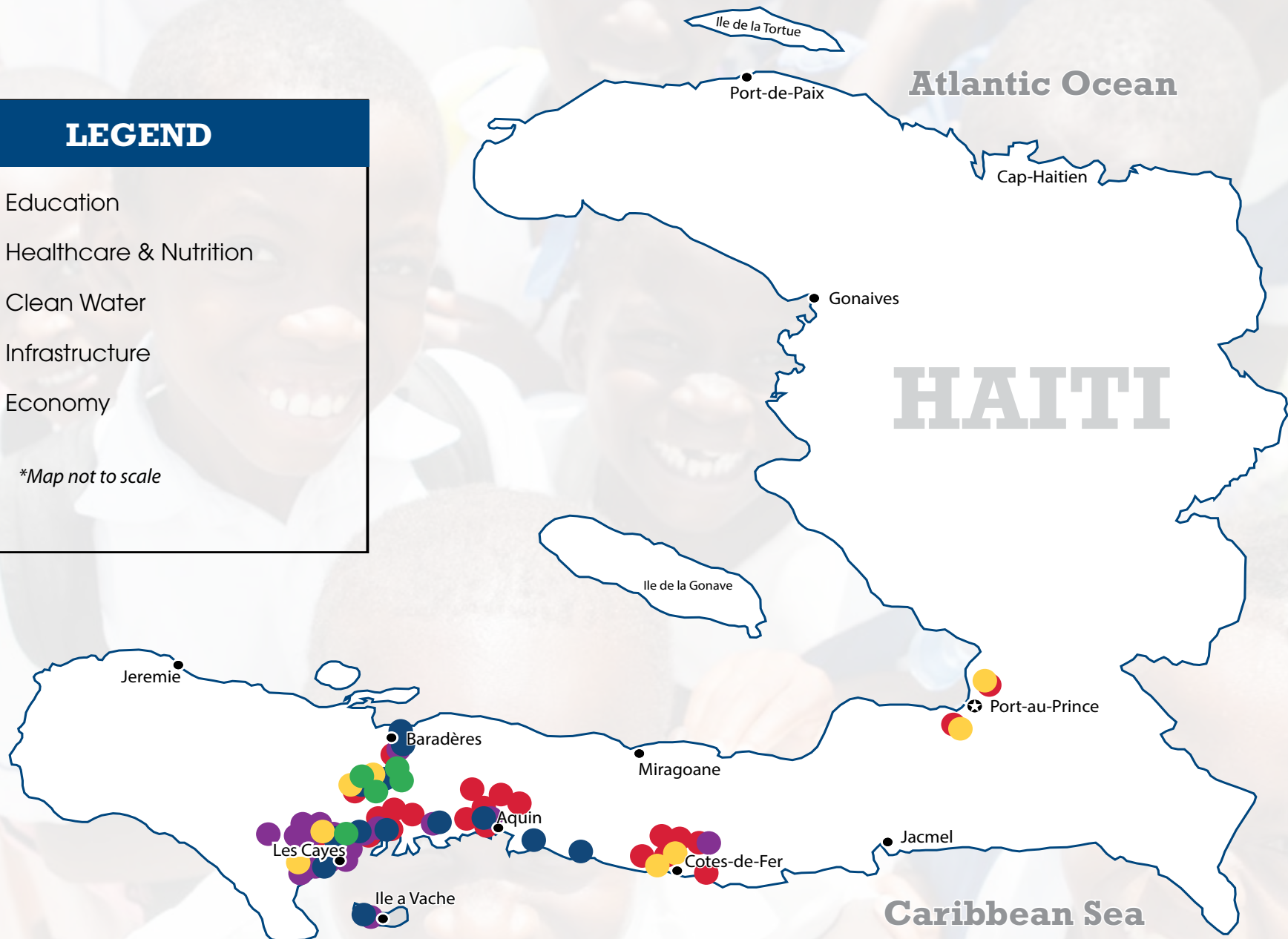
Provides 832 students in our two sustainable community schools with hot, nutritious and locally produced meals every school day.
