## A Letter from Our CEO

Dear Hope for Haiti Family,

With a legacy that began in 1989, Hope for Haiti has always valued resilience as an essential quality in meeting the diverse and complex challenges of working to alleviate poverty in Haiti — and last year was no different.

It was another challenging year for many Haitians, especially those who live below the poverty line. Rising inflation, political uncertainty, and civil unrest were just a few of the challenges that our team and the people of Haiti confronted on a daily basis.

But, with the expertise, passion, and resilience of our board of directors, our team, our partners, and our generous donors — we were ready. Ready to improve the quality of education and training for more than 7,200 Haitian school children and 420 Haitian teachers. Ready to provide access to healthcare for more than 16,000 children, parents, and grandparents. Ready to help rural communities in Haiti build vital infrastructure such as schools, sanitation blocks, and wells. Ready to help 2,700 families access clean drinking water, and ready to provide loans and grants to Haitian entrepreneurs seeking economic opportunity.

The theme of this year's annual report is, "A More Resilient Haiti." We chose this theme because the resilience of our Haitian partners and our team in Haiti and their ability to adapt in the face of adversity inspires us all to help improve the quality of life for the people of Haiti, particularly children. Our programs are designed to assist communities in strengthening their own resilience, and when families in Haiti are left vulnerable to forces beyond their control, the entire Hope for Haiti network stands ready to help them bounce back. Resilience is a core value on which Hope for Haiti was founded, and it is one of the main reasons why FY18 proved to be another strong year of programmatic impact.

Our ability to help Haitians strengthen their own resilience would not be possible without the transformational contributions from such a diverse and nuanced network of donors. It's the generous support from individuals, corporations, families, faith-based organizations, and foundations that allows us to do the work we do—and for that we are grateful for your trust and generosity.

# Marre à Coiffe: A Community's Resilience

On the inauguration day of their new school, students met us at the bottom of the mountain. As we hiked together for the next two and a half hours up a steep and narrow footpath, it was clear that the journey with us to the top of the mountain was their way of saying thank you for helping rebuild their school after it was destroyed by Hurricane Matthew in October 2016.

Our gratitude for the students and the parents of Marre à Coiffe is reciprocal. Collaboration and Resilience are Hope for Haiti core values, and our partnership with and the determination of the entire community was what made the new school project possible. It takes one person eight hours to transport a single bag of cement up the mountain to the new school site in Marre à Coiffe, a community with no automobile access. We needed to transport more than 350 bags of cement and tons of construction materials up the mountain, and the parents and families of Marre à Coiffe stepped up to carry the materials up the mountain any way they could. They did it to improve the quality of education for their children.

Talking to Benito Jean Louis, the school director at Marre à Coiffe, you can tell the difference the school has made. Jean Louis states that all of the Hope for Haiti programs have benefitted him and his three children, but the new school block has made an incredible impact. He states that “for decades, the school had operated in a makeshift and dilapidated structure that was then destroyed by Hurricane Matthew.” Since Hope for Haiti partnered with the community to rebuild, the school is now “beautiful, with seven classrooms, a system to catch rainwater, and latrines for the students and staff.” Hope for Haiti also provides Teacher Trainings and job opportunities, repaired a road in the community, and distributed Sawyer Water Filtration systems to 150 families. All

combined, these activities help to build a sustainable community that can more easily respond to adverse events in the future. There is a saying in Haiti, “Deye mon, gen mon,” which means beyond mountains, there are mountains. Because of YOU, the community of Marre à Coiffe overcame its challenges and the future looks bright for the next generation.

The community of Marre à Coiffe is a shining example of a more resilient Haiti, one that does not back down in the face of hardship and instead works to build a better, stronger future. The students, in particular, inspired us with their commitment to education and their ability to overcome numerous challenges to continuing their education, including one of the most powerful hurricanes to ever make landfall in the history of Haiti. And if you ask Jean Louis, “for the first time, we have a school worthy of the Marre à Coiffe name. This makes all the difference in the community's life and our children's education.” Children like Ifencia Simon, an 11 year-old who's lived in Marre à Coiffe her entire life and who believes “everyone in Marre à Coiffe is proud of the school. Having this beautiful school here is like a miracle. By having the chance to go to school and receive a good education, I am on my way to fulfill my dream to become a nurse and help my community.”

As we look back on the transformation of our work in Haiti, we would like to express our deepest gratitude to everyone who supports Hope for Haiti. To our donors, our staff, and our community partners like the students and parents in Marre à Coiffe- Thank you for being part of a movement that is much greater than ourselves, and thank you for helping us to build a More Resilient Haiti.

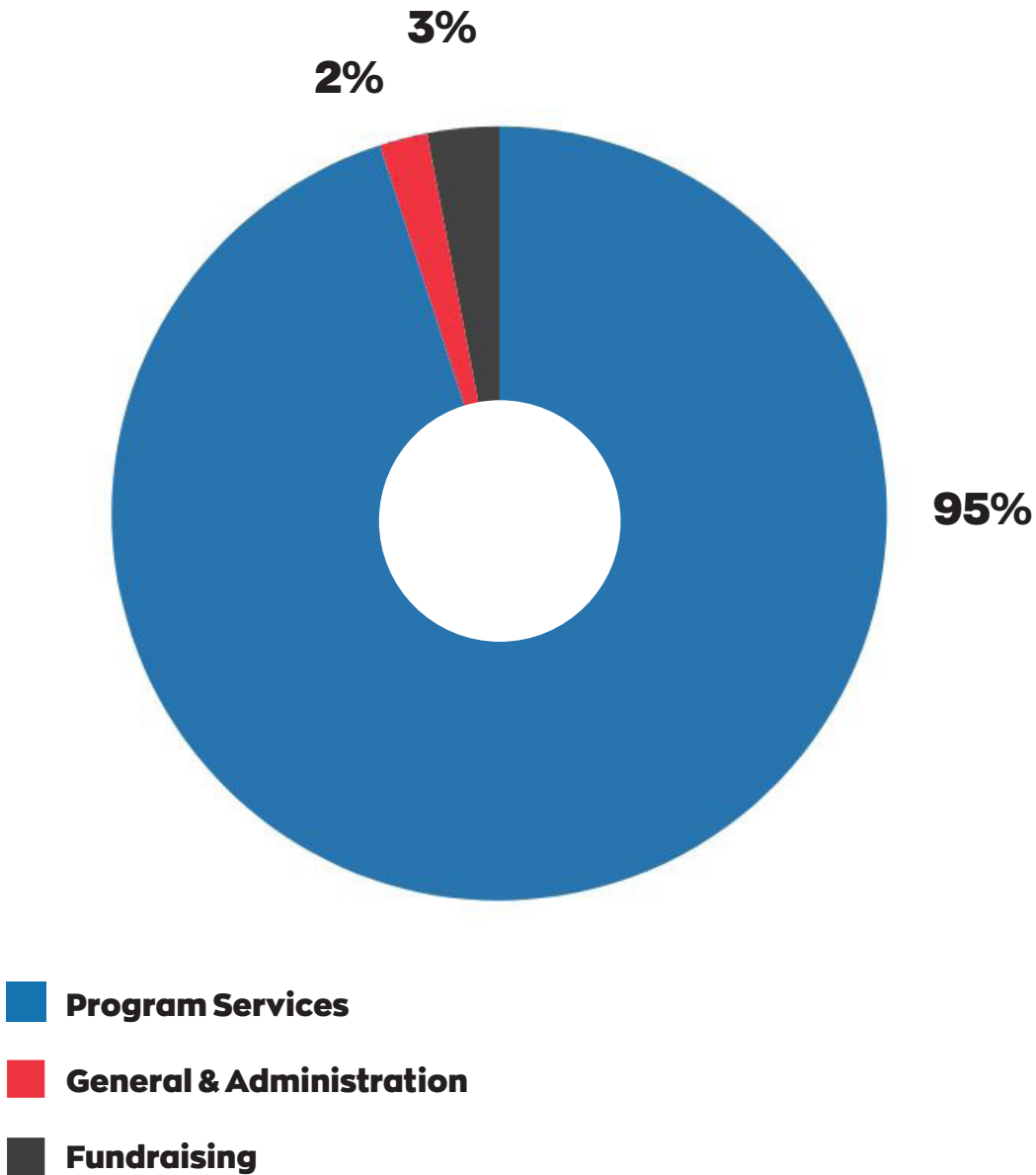

For example:

- **\$30,000:** Participate in a service learning trip to Haiti (6-8 people) and see the impact of your investment in action
- **\$20,000:** Supply over 1,500 children, parents and grandparents in two Hope for Haiti partner communities with access to clean water
- **\$10,000:** Provide a stipend for 10 Community Health Workers to provide school based public health programs in partner communities
- **\$5,000:** Equip 1,000 primary school students in Hope for Haiti partner communities with all the supplies needed to start the school year on the right foot. This includes books, uniforms, desks, and school supplies
- **\$2,500:** Provide training for 20 teachers at two Hope for Haiti partner schools for one year, which includes workshops, materials, and follow-up evaluations
- **\$1,000:** Help plant a new school garden, by funding the cost of start up seeds, supplies and materials
- **\$500:** Provide a community in rural southern Haiti with a one-day Mobile Clinic. For many in these communities, a Hope for Haiti Mobile Clinic is their first opportunity to receive medical care
- **\$250:** Equip a family with a water filtration bucket that will filter up to one million gallons of water and provide training for family members on its use
- **\$100:** Covers the cost of four medical consultations at the Hope for Haiti Infirmary
- **\$50:** Send 10 students back to school with all the supplies needed for a successful year
