It serves as our guiding compass as we navigate the social, economic, and health impacts of the global pandemic caused by the spread of COVID-19. Thoughtful collective action, in collaboration with our strategic partners, and investing in local community leadership also played significant roles in our approach to helping solve some of the most pressing problems facing Haitian families in 2020. Systemic disruptions to schooling, an acute lack of access to healthcare, scarcity of clean drinking water, and economic inequality were just a few of the major challenges Haitians continued to face this past year.

With your generous support and advocacy for our mission in 2020, Hope for Haiti's team was able to achieve the impact you see laid out in this report. All of this work was accomplished while maintaining the highest standards of transparency, accountability, and good governance. We are proud to report that in 2020, Hope for Haiti received the highest possible ratings on Charity Navigator and Guidestar, two of the non-profit industry's most respected independent charity rating organizations. Thanks to the overwhelming support we received from YOU, we were able to invest more than 94 cents out of every donated dollar into our poverty alleviation programs to support Haitian systems of education, healthcare, community infrastructure, access to clean water, and economic opportunity.

This year's Gratitude Report does more than convey the metrics of our success. It also tells the stories of students using computers for the first time, of mothers accessing life-saving healthcare and medication for their children, of tree seedlings being planted to restore the local environment and nourish families, of the transformative effects of clean water on children's health and academic achievement, and of the power of investments made in Haitian entrepreneurs to sustain and grow their businesses in the most difficult of economic times.

Featured Story: Brendjalove Germain

Hope for Haiti's approach to poverty alleviation centers on holistic and integrated programming weaving together education, healthcare, access to clean water, and economic opportunities. The true impact of our programming can be best seen at the community level. Brendjalove Germain is in the eighth grade at the Roger Dunwell Community School and has spent her whole life in the Hope for Haiti partner community of Tête l'Étang with her parents and two older sisters. Her mother died in 2006, and her father was blinded in an accident leaving him unable to work and the family without a stable source of income. On a typical day, Brendjalove is responsible for most of the household tasks. She cleans the house daily, washes the dishes using a Hope for Haiti water filtration system, and handles the laundry while her sisters take care of cooking and errands. Brendjalove notes that her family has faced many challenges especially in light of COVID-19, such as having enough food to eat.

When asked which Hope for Haiti program has had the biggest impact on her life, she excitedly told us about the Education Program, especially the new computer lab at her school, the Roger Dunwell Community School: "I have always had a passion for learning about computers, but I never had the money to attend a computer class. I was so excited when Hope for Haiti brought a brand new computer lab to my school, and I was able to start learning the computer skills I need for my future." According to her teachers and Hope for Haiti staff members who have met her, Brendjalove is immensely charming and has great aspirations for her career -- she wants to be a human rights attorney when she grows up so that she can make the world a better place. Her favorite subject is Biology and she loves the public health lessons led by our Community Health Workers: "One of the most exciting lessons was on high blood pressure, and I loved sharing what I learned with my family. We are so lucky to have been able to see a doctor at the Hope for Haiti mobile healthcare clinic." Though her life isn't without its challenges, she radiates joy and has a resilient spirit that encompasses all of Hope for Haiti's core values.

Our COVID-19 Response Highlights

Treated 1,412 chronic and urgent care patients at our Infirmary St. Etienne before reopening for general consultations, including providing chronic care patients with two months of medication to minimize travel.

Provided over 7,000 students and 424 teachers with a washable mask, COVID-19 hygiene kit, and COVID-19 prevention training.

Distributed \$20 million in on-hand medical supplies, medication, and PPE to the most vulnerable Haitians and 34 healthcare partners in southern Haiti.

Executed \$30,000 in cash transfers to 429 teachers in our education network and mobilized them to share accurate prevention strategies to stop the spread of COVID-19.

Your Impact in Action: Education

Jean François Louizius is one of Hope for Haiti's 20 college scholarship recipients and a graduate from the high school in our first partner community, Ravine Sable. Jean François grew up with five siblings and often walked hours to school because his family could not afford transportation. He is now studying Business Administration at the Business and Technology Institute in Les Cayes, and hopes to one day launch a startup business in his hometown. Jean François credits the example set by his parents as his inspiration to finish school: "My hunger for an education is stronger than any hardships I faced growing up. Thanks to Hope for Haiti, I can realize my dream to one day start my own company. I promise to take advantage of every opportunity given to me and am so grateful to Hope for Haiti's supporters for investing in my education."

Jonathan is a hard-working 11-year old boy. Outside of school, he loves growing crops and raising animals with his father, Jocelyn Cadet, who is also a farmer at the school garden in their community. Every morning, Jonathan gets up at six o'clock to go to the field to take care of his goats and sheep. At 7 AM he gets back home to bathe, eat breakfast and go to school. It takes him less than five minutes to walk to school. Jonathan loves French, Math and Natural Science. He wants to be an agronomist when he grows up. He says: "Thanks to Hope for Haiti's support of my school, hundreds of children like me have the chance to get an education. My father earns his living and takes care of us by working in the school garden. Thank you, Hope for Haiti, for being here for us! Thank you for staying alongside us even during the most challenging moments!"

Healthcare Highlights

Your Impact in Action: Healthcare

Jean Kevin Banatte is a one-year-old baby living in Les Cayes. His mother, Blanc Maloune, is currently unemployed. Being unskilled, it is hard for Madame Maloune to find work, so she now stays home to care for her children. Kevin visited the ISE for the first time in July with multiple symptoms and was immediately hospitalized. His mother visited the ISE regularly to pick up all the medication Kevin would need during his stay. Kevin was discharged from the hospital 15 days later and his mother took him back to the ISE for another physical assessment. According to Kevin's mother, his condition has improved: Kevin is joyful, and although he still has pruritus occasionally, his skin condition has also improved. Kevin's mother is grateful for the complete care the ISE provided for her child, especially as she was financially unable to pay for his care. Once his malnutrition levels have improved, Kevin will be enrolled in the Nutrilite Little Bits Program to receive ongoing nutritional support. Thankfully, children like Kevin have access to healthcare and nutrition services that will help him realize his full potential. Your gift makes this work possible.

Your Impact in Action: Water

"My name is Tiogene Mayline. I am 17 years old and in 9th grade. I would like to thank everyone who has supported Hope for Haiti so they could bring these filtration systems to protect our lives in the village against waterborne diseases, like cholera and other diseases that we can contract by drinking non-filtered water. We are very exposed to these contaminated water sources, so now that we have the home filtration system to treat our water and share with neighbors who have not had the chance to receive a filtration system, this will help us all fight these diseases. When I finish school, I want to be a doctor because I witness that a lot of people lost their lives because of a problem of access to healthcare in the village. Since we don't have a functional dispensary in the village, I would like to find a scholarship and come back to my community to provide my services to the community."



Economy Highlights

Your Impact in Action: Economy

Maguilda Elasco, 62, was born and raised in Morency and lives there with her five children. Maguilda's mother was a farmer and her father was a fisherman. At a young age, Maguilda started helping her parents with their business when they would bring her along to the markets. At 20 years old, after the passing of her parents, Maguilda started her own business selling patties during recess at the local school. In 2016, Hurricane Matthew destroyed many things in its path, including Maguilda's business. Fortunately, in 2018, Hope for Haiti piloted a microloan program and Maguilda was able to receive a small loan of \$2,000 to rebuild. And in 2020, she was able to benefit from a micro grant following the effects of the civil unrest in the county. Both the loan and the microgrant provided by Hope for Haiti allowed Maguilda to continue paying for her children's education. Her dream is to open a bakery where she can make patties and cookies to sell in Morency. Maguilda says, "If I am able to continue with my patties business, it is because of you. Thank you so much for impacting my life."




