## A Letter From Our CEO And Board Chair

In Haiti, there is a saying: *“Se nan tèt ansanm, nou jwenn fòs”* (It is in unity that we find strength.) This mindset guided us every step of the way in 2024. Through every challenge and every breakthrough, we moved forward - not alone, but ansanm. Together.

Thanks to the extraordinary commitment of our staff, our partners, and generous supporters like you, our healthcare team provided over 100,000 medical consultations through our clinic and mobile clinics (the celebration of which is pictured on the cover of this report). With support from our Gift-in-Kind partners like Americares, MAP International, CMMB, and Insulin for Life, we imported and distributed just under \$49 million in medications, medical supplies, and PPE - free of charge - to Haiti’s most vulnerable patients and 56 partner healthcare facilities. Through this expansive healthcare network, **Hope for Haiti’s programs impacted the lives of more than one million children, parents, and grandparents across southern Haiti this past year.**

In our 24 partner schools, 7,395 students received a quality education, and 2,294 of them learned vital digital skills in established computer labs. We supported 391 teachers with training and direct salary subsidies because we believe *“Edikasyon se kle liberasyon”* - education is the key to liberation. And we planted 3,832 seedlings across school-based nurseries, because restoring the earth is the foundation of strong, thriving communities.

Through our Digital Cash Assistance program, women-led households gained the flexibility to meet their families’ most urgent needs. And through 16 Village Savings & Loan Associations, local communities built economic resilience, collectively saving more than \$35,000 and empowering nearly 700 women and girls in financial literacy and entrepreneurship.

**These numbers tell a story. But behind each one is a name, a family, and a brighter future.** Like Kesna, who found life-saving asthma treatment at our healthcare clinic. Like Roselène, a vendor who grew her business through dignity and training. And like Augustin, a school director who continues to shape young minds despite limited resources.

We share this report not just to reflect on how Hope for Haiti is helping solve challenges for children, families, and communities in southern Haiti, but to celebrate what’s possible when we work tèt ansanm. When we lift one another up with our commitment to long-term partnership, resourcing community leaders, and most importantly: believing in the limitless potential of the Haitian people. When we choose hope over despair, and action over silence.

**That’s when we see true progress, when we are united together, in community.**

# 2024 Impact: By The Numbers

## Healthcare



-  **100,369** medical consultations (general, pediatric, nutrition, laboratory, wound care, gynecology, chronic care, or physical assessment) provided through our Infirmary St. Etienne and mobile clinics
-  **\$49M** in medical supplies, medication, and PPE distributed to the most vulnerable patients for free as well as 56 healthcare partners in southern Haiti
-  **15,916** hours worked by community health workers (teaching, planning, administering first aid, or advocacy)
-  **13,973** cancer screenings performed (8,734 cervical cancer screenings and 5,071 breast cancer screenings)
-  **4,291** patients received vaccinations (pediatric vaccination or COVID-19 vaccination patients)
-  **2,363** children enrolled in Hope for Haiti's nutrition program
-  **194** mobile clinics provided in rural communities





## Education

-  **7,395** students received an education at our 24 partner schools
-  **386** primary- and secondary-school teachers supported through programming such as direct cash transfers for salary support and teacher training
-  **50** college scholarships provided to graduates of partner schools, 64% of which were provided to female students
-  **3,832** seedlings planted across 6 school nurseries
-  **2,294** students attended IT classes through computer labs installed at partner schools

## Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene (WASH)

-  **120M+** gallons of water filtered since 2016 through systems distributed by Hope for Haiti
-  **672** water filtration systems distributed to families in partner communities and throughout the south of Haiti

## Economic Development

-  **\$35,431** saved by Village Savings and Loan Associations (VSLAs) across 16 VSLA programs established by Hope for Haiti
-  **693** women & female students trained on financial literacy, entrepreneurship, and business management

# Resilience in the Face of Chronic Illness: Kesna’s Story

Kesna Mesidor, a 54-year-old woman from the island of Île-à-Vache, has spent her entire life surrounded by the beauty of the beaches and fishing communities. But living 6 miles off the coast of Les Cayes brings tremendous challenges, especially when it comes to accessing essential healthcare. Kesna has battled asthma since childhood, a condition that often leaves her struggling to breathe. “When I have an asthma attack, I feel really unwell. Sometimes, I can’t recognize anyone and start speaking incoherently. It’s like my lungs are full, and I can’t breathe at all,” Kesna shares.

As a single mother of three, Kesna faces the added challenge of managing her health while raising children, two of whom also suffer from asthma. The situation is even more difficult living in a remote area with limited access to medical care, and each asthma attack becomes a frightening race to reach Les Cayes for treatment, often requiring a perilous boat ride. For the past 15 years, Hope for Haiti has provided a lifeline to Kesna and her children, offering them access to life-saving medications, regular check-ups, and essential education on managing asthma.

Despite these challenges, Kesna remains incredibly resilient, doing everything in her power to ensure her children receive the care they need to live healthier lives. She attends her medical appointments every month, ensuring she stays on top of her treatment, and relies on Hope for Haiti’s Infirmary St. Etienne for the medications

that help her manage the condition. But recently, Kesna’s condition has worsened, and her asthma attacks have become more severe and prolonged, putting her at greater risk.

When Kesna arrived at the clinic in critical condition, Hope for Haiti’s team acted swiftly to stabilize her, administering nebulizers and saline solution to improve her breathing. However, due to the severity of her condition, Kesna needed specialized care that could not be provided at the clinic. Hope for Haiti immediately referred her to a trusted medical partner through our Referral Program, covering all the costs of her treatment, including consultations, tests, hospitalization, and medications.

Hope for Haiti ensured that Kesna received the care she urgently needed, without any financial burden standing in her way. For Kesna, this was more than just receiving medical care, it was the chance to regain control over her health and continue caring for her family. “If it weren’t for Hope for Haiti, I would have died. What this hospital has done for me is what only my mother and father could have done. I will never stop thanking the Hope for Haiti team for the way they have helped me with this illness. They have never given up on me. Mesi Anpil Anpil!”

Kesna’s story is a testament to the resilience of the Haitian people, the critical role Hope for Haiti plays in providing access to healthcare, and the importance of unwavering support from donors like you.

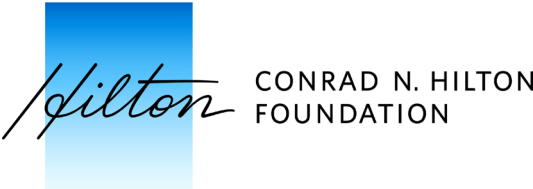

The project has given me more self-confidence and I thank Hope for Haiti and Conrad N. Hilton Foundation for their contributions.”

## Empowering Families: Digital Cash Assistance (DCA) Project

In the wake of the 2021 earthquake and ongoing economic challenges in Haiti, Hope for Haiti (HFH), with funding from the Conrad N. Hilton Foundation, launched the Digital Cash Assistance (DCA) project to address the critical food security needs of vulnerable households in the commune of Les Cayes. The project specifically targeted 334 women, including female-headed households, mothers enrolled in Hope for Haiti’s nutrition program, and other at-risk women in the area. The initiative was designed to provide immediate financial relief while preserving the dignity of participants, giving them the autonomy to purchase what they needed most.

From August to December 2024, the beneficiaries received six distributions of \$75 each to help meet their basic needs. In total, \$150,300 was disbursed directly to the participants. In addition to alleviating immediate hunger, the program also fostered economic empowerment by strengthening 30 participating vendors, providing them with business training in the use of digital currency and tools to improve inventory management and profit tracking.

This project not only improved food access for some of the most vulnerable families but also laid the groundwork for long-term resilience by building the financial capabilities of women and local businesses. The DCA program is a powerful example of how innovative financial solutions can play a pivotal role in helping families weather economic instability and emerge stronger.





## Collaboration in Action: Rebuilding Homes in Ravine Sable

In the aftermath of the 2021 earthquake, communities in southern Haiti faced unimaginable devastation. Many homes were reduced to rubble, leaving families vulnerable and displaced. Amid the destruction, Hope for Haiti's commitment to rebuilding and restoring hope remained steadfast. Through collaboration with HomePlan and the Man Dodo Foundation, a new chapter began for five families in Hope for Haiti's partner community of Ravine Sable.

This partnership brought together the strengths of each organizations, working hand-in-hand to build five earthquake-resistant homes that provide safety and security for families who lost everything. These homes were constructed to withstand future natural disasters, ensuring that the families now have a strong foundation from which they can begin anew.

The inauguration ceremony was a moment of reflection and gratitude. "When we stand in front of these new homes, remember this is only the beginning – the journey to rebuild Haiti continues," said Hope for Haiti's Chief Program Officer, Linda Thélémaque. One of the home recipients, Anasta Bacien, echoed Linda's sentiment: "This new house has changed my living conditions and my family's lives. After the earthquake, I lived in a house where, when it rained, there was water all over the inside. Now, I live in a comfortable house and I am no longer afraid of the rain. I feel more safe."

This partnership exemplifies the power of collaboration in humanitarian work, and a continued commitment to creating sustainable solutions to help families thrive. With the support of partners like HomePlan and the Man Dodo Foundation, we are one step closer to rebuilding lives and providing a brighter future for all in southern Haiti.

## Hope in the Classroom: Supporting Educators, Shaping the Future

In Haiti, the challenges faced by teachers are immense. From financial instability to inadequate resources, the environment in which educators work is often difficult and under-resourced. Yet, despite these hardships, teachers continue to play an integral role in shaping the future of their communities and the nation as a whole. At Hope for Haiti, we understand that supporting teachers is essential to creating long-term, positive change, and that is why we have focused our efforts on providing teachers with the tools and support they need to succeed.

One of the most crucial ways Hope for Haiti supports teachers is through ongoing training and professional development programs. These programs are designed to improve teaching methodologies, enhance classroom management, and introduce modern educational tools that benefit both teachers and students. By providing professional training, we empower teachers to deliver high-quality education, even in the most challenging environments. This investment in teachers directly impacts the students they teach, helping to foster a generation of learners who are prepared to become the leaders of tomorrow.

In addition to training, Hope for Haiti recognizes the financial struggles faced by teachers in Haiti, and we offer salary subsidies to ensure they are fairly compensated for their dedication and hard work. Many schools in Haiti operate on limited budgets, and teachers often face the challenge of low pay, which can lead to burnout and demotivation. By offering salary support, we help ease these burdens, allowing teachers to focus on their work and remain committed to their students' success.

Augustin Betrand, the director of Christ-Roi Presbyterian School in Cammy, shares the profound impact of Hope for Haiti's support on his school and community:

"Since 2004, I have had the privilege of leading this school, and one of my greatest experiences has been contributing to its growth from operating in a church. Thanks to the support we received from Hope for Haiti, we now have nine well-maintained classrooms. The support from Hope for Haiti is truly invaluable to all of us. For example, regarding the salary subsidy, it is extremely important in our context, where schools face economic hardship and parents are unable to provide a reasonable salary for teachers, leading to demotivation among the teaching staff. In this regard, the salary subsidy is an absolute necessity for us.

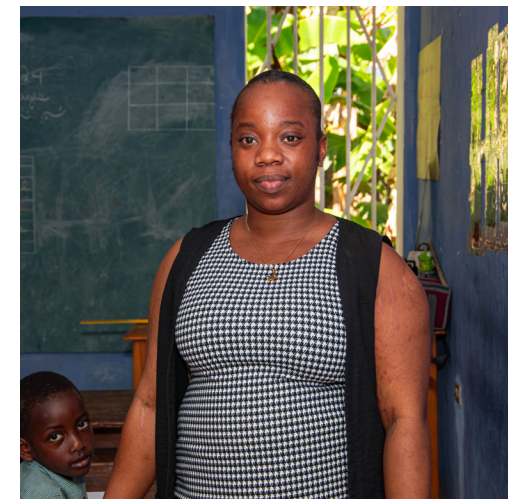
Dorsainvil Michena Ayoumie, a first grade teacher at Presbytère Sainte-Anne de Boirond School, shares in this sentiment:

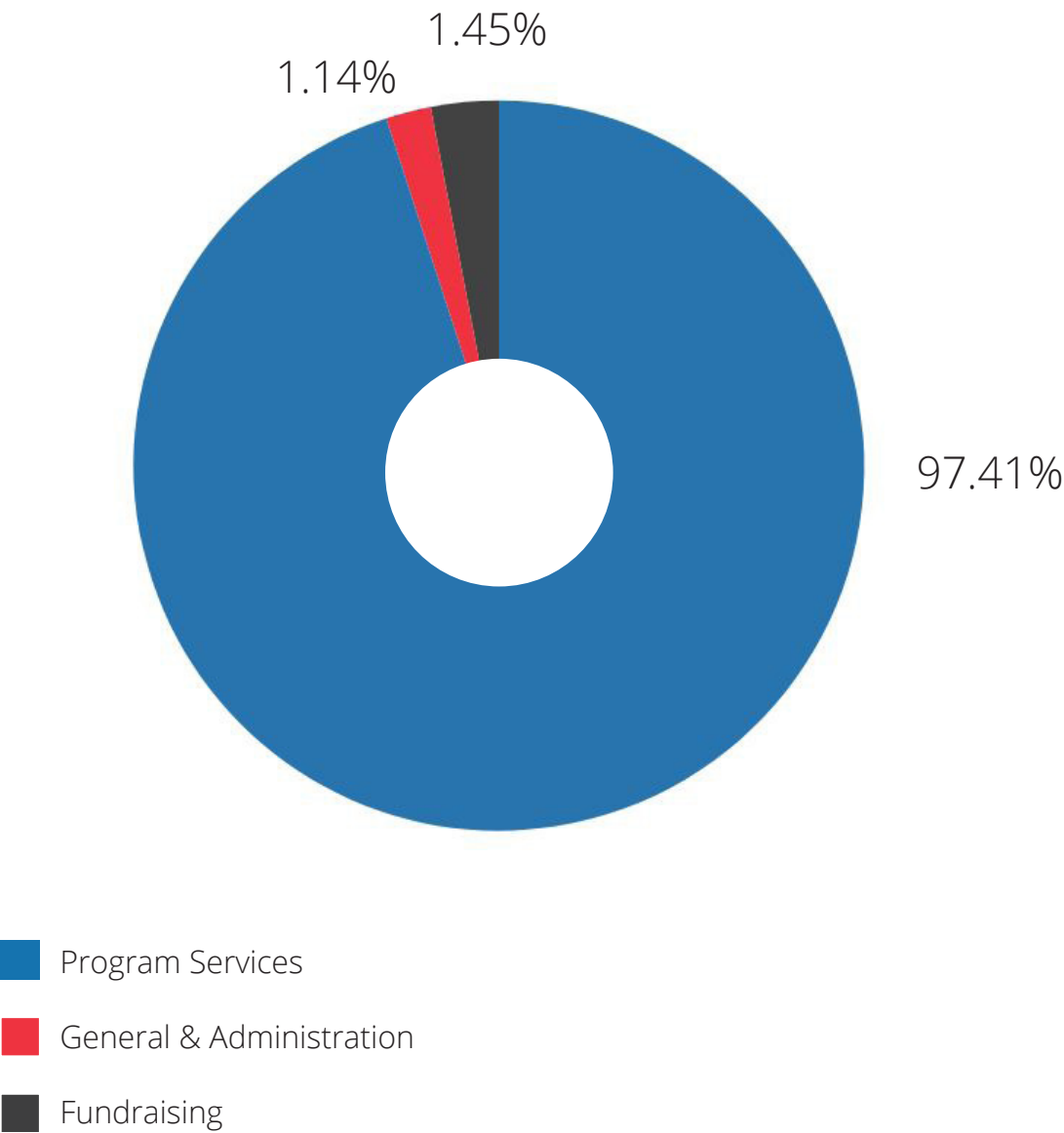
